**Teachers! The Professional Educator Standards Board** announces

the expansion of the Educator Retooling Conditional Scholarship Pro-

gram. This program provides financial support (scholarships up to \$3,000) to Washington State certified teachers who seek to add an endorsement in a subject or geographic shortage area. Up until recently, this program covered math and science only, but the state legislature recently amended the law to expand this program to cover more short-

Typical shortage areas include Bilingual Education, Computer Science Education, English Language Learner, Environmental and Sustainability

age areas, as determined by the Professional Educator Standards

Education, Mathematics, Science, and Special Education. In addition, other shortage areas will also be considered, with all applications being evaluated based in part on the strength of their shortage evidence. The first application deadline is quickly approaching on September 25, with the first awards going out two to three weeks thereafter. There are two additional application deadlines over the course of the year: January 8, 2016, and April 29, 2016.
